We sometimes have left over news items are too good or too exciting for the Forum so they're printed in our new paper blog: The Ad Valorem Bore Em: Stuff Too Good Enough for the Forum. It's our version of a **blog** except it's not on the internet.

<u>Most Unusual Telephone Call</u> This last month Luke Weese was in the mail room so he didn't have many calls, but we did get an interesting one. A woman from Norman called and asked if the Ad Valorem Division had anything to do with dog licensing. Luke told her we didn't, but he learned that the City of Norman requires an \$8 annual license for dogs. He gave her the correct telephone number. The real question, is if I were looking for information about a dog license, why would the first place I'd call be the Ad Valorem Division?

- <u>Forms, Forms</u> We've had two meetings with the Forms Committee. I thought <u>the</u> process has been good. Many of the forms are in pretty good shape. The committee worked on a couple of forms, decided not to open certain cans of worms, and then decided to leave them alone. I'm hoping that at the end of the process the forms will be improved and we'll have room for some accommodation for computer forms, particularly for some of the high volume counties. The purpose of this process, in our view, is to get more standardization in the forms used.
- <u>Doodling? Sign of a Bad Employee?</u> Doodling because you're bored? Most people would say a doodler was not paying attention, a sign of a bad employee. According to some recent studies, doodling actually keeps your mind alert rather than going off into a daydream. One study showed that people who were doodling while listening to a telephone call were able to recall 30 percent more than those who did not. According to Jackie Andrade, a psychologist, it helps keep you mind focused.

<u>Multitasking is a waste of time</u> People who like to do several things at the same time think that they're getting a lot done. A Stanford study showed that they're actually worse. They have poorer memory and are more distracted. Professor Clifford Nast says, "High multitaskers are lousy at everything that's necessary for multitasking." <u>Best Tip</u> Yes, everyone gets frustrated working with mobile homes, right? I had_a couple of questions last week, and I discovered that, really, the best source of information (not calling Kenny C, that is.) is in the pink paper Quick Reference Guide to Manufactured Homes. This was distributed at our recent assessors educational conference in 2009. Kenny C worked on that project, along with help from county assessors, Tax Commission Motor Vehicle, Treasurers, and Department of Public Safety. It is a really good place to start on answering mobile home questions, particularly if you don't work with them everyday. Paula Gibson has been the mobile home wizard in-training so she's becoming our mobile home back-up person. The mobile home guidelines are on the web if you need it.


